On Good Friday we welcomed over 20 children to our Fishers Good Friday Project, which included creating an Easter Garden and practising the Gospel Drama for Easter Day.

It was wonderful to welcome so many people to the church, beautifully decorated by Lynn Curnow and her team, on **Easter Day**. Twenty children hunted for Easter eggs after the service.

The church **Lighting Appeal** has raised enough for 57 of the 70 lights we need. The Spring Concert will have brought in more. Just one last push!


